With 49 Academy Award nominations, Williams is the second most-nominated person, after Walt Disney. Do you want to know why the Williams has become the Hollywood music godfather?*

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


John Towner Williams was born in February 8, 1932. He is the one of most successful film composer. At 1980, he was appointed as the Boston Pops Orchestra nineteenth commander, since 1993 has served as the orchestra conductor emeritus retirement. At the same time also served as the artist that the Boston Symphony Orchestra the Tangle wood Music Festival.

In a career spanning over six decades, he has composed some of the most popular and recognizable film scores in cinematic history, including Jaws, Family Plot (Alfred Hitchcock's final film), the Star Wars series, Superman, the Indiana Jones series, E.T. the Extra-Terrestrial, the first two Home Alone films, Hook, Jurassic Park, Schindler's List, Saving Private Ryan, the first three Harry Potter films, Catch Me If You Can, Memoirs of a Geisha, War Horse, and Lincoln. He has had a long

association with director Steven Spielberg, composing the music for all but one (The Color Purple) of Spielberg's major feature-length films.

In Jurassic Park—the classic science fiction movie, he combined the piano and string together, to create a magnificent scene, warm emotion and vitality primitive. The Schindlers List soundtrack is one of the most classic works and breakthrough in transition. He didn't use a large Symphony that he has been good at, but with a violin solo as the music tone, echoed this piece of black and white photographic style with a documentary temperament. Indisputably won the best soundtrack award in academy again.



After the movie "Great white shark" get a huge success, Spielberg's brother Lucas at a cost of 10 million dollars, take the science fiction film "Star Wars". Lucas asked Spielberg who is the music soundtrack master, Spielberg didn't hesitate and said: "John Williams!" John think the movie should use the romantic music to let high school boys watch conviviality. So he wrote a "empire" style of music, but also to the London Symphony Orchestra hundred ensemble. Soon afterwards the film sold worldwide and the soundtrack is very popular.

The last time John Williams received two nominations at the same time in 2001, when the "artificial intelligence" and "Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's stone" soundtrack are both listed. Meanwhile, John Williams also appointed as the academy

awards commander. Therefore some people specifically asked that year the academy ceremony director Michael Seligman: if the Williams won, he would speak all the time as long as he wants. Because the band is followed him, he did not command, the band can't remind winners speech timeout. However Michael Seligman replied: "no, we prepared the tape, if the timeout we will put the tape on the music to reminds him." Of course, the last tape is not playing, because that year the "ring king" Howard Seaan beat John Williams.

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# Hip-hop Never Die

Hip hop music, also called hip-hop, rap music, or hip-hop music, is a music genre consisting of a stylized rhythmic music that commonly accompanies rapping, a rhythmic and rhyming speech that is chanted. It developed as part of hip hop culture, a subculture defined by four key stylistic elements: MCing/rapping, DJing/scratching, break dancing, and graffiti writing. Other elements include sampling (or synthesis), and beat boxing.

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While often used to refer to rapping, "hip hop" more properly

denotes the practice of the entire subculture. The term *hip hop music* is sometimes used synonymously with the term *rap music*, though rapping is not a required component of hip hop music; the genre may also incorporate other elements of hip hop culture, including DJing and scratching, beatboxing, and instrumental tracks.

There are four periods in the history of Hip-hop: Roots of hip-hop, old school hip-hop, new school hip-hop and golden age hip-hop. And there are so many kinds of hip-hop music in US, such as Acid rap, Bounce music, Electro, Freestyle rap, Gangsta rap, Grime, Hip-hop soul and so on. There are mainly two schools of US hip-hop: West Coast Hip-hop and East Coast Hip-hop. The most famous one is West Coast Hip-hop.



After [N.W.A](#) broke up, [Dr. Dre](#) (a former member) released [The Chronic](#) in 1992, which peaked at #1 on the R&B/hip hop chart, #3 on the pop chart and spawned a #2 pop single with "[Nuthin' but a 'G' Thang](#)." *The Chronic* took West Coast rap in a new direction, influenced strongly by [P funk](#) artists, melding smooth and easy funk beats with slowly drawled lyrics. This

came to be known as [G-funk](#) and dominated mainstream hip hop for several years through a roster of artists on [Death Row Records](#), including [Tupac Shakur](#), whose double disc album [All Eyez on Me](#) was a big hit with hit songs "[Ambitionz az a Ridah](#)" and "[2 of Amerikaz Most Wanted](#)", and [Snoop Dogg](#), whose [Doggystyle](#) included the songs "[What's My Name?](#)" and "[Gin and Juice](#)", both top ten hits. As the Los Angeles-based label [Death Row Records](#) built an empire around [Dr. Dre](#), [Snoop Dogg](#), and the rapper-actor [Tupac Shakur](#). It also entered into a rivalry with New York City's [Bad Boy Records](#). (See the article on the [East Coast-West Coast hip hop rivalry](#).)



In fact, WC Hip-hop has given a great influence all over the world.
